### **Slavery and Human Trafficking statement under the United Kingdom Modern Slavery Act 2015**

MTI Wireless Edge Ltd. (“**MTI**”) is a leading technology company focused on comprehensive communication and radio frequency solutions across multiple sectors. Central to our identity is a commitment to corporate responsibility. We continually move toward increased transparency and accountability to the public through our corporate governance responsibilities, performance and vision for the future.

It is within the above framework that we make this statement under the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015, which require us to disclose our efforts to eradicate slavery and human trafficking from our direct supply chain for the products we sell.

Our supply chains mainly consist of electronic systems and components manufacturers.

#### **Our commitment to ethical trading**

Our Code of Ethics (see <https://mtiwirelessedge.com/code-of-business-conduct-and-ethics/>) reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chain.

#### **Due diligence and risk assessment**

To help identify and monitor the risk of slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain we vet suppliers and sub-contractors to ensure that they are committed to ethical labour practices. We include anti-slavery and human tracking provisions in all our contracts with suppliers.

#### **Ongoing commitment**

We require all new suppliers to agree to our Code of Ethics, and are actively seeking to increase the number of our existing suppliers who commit to our Code of Ethics.

We remain committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain. We will continue to review and assess our policies, procedures and practices on an ongoing basis to determine any enhancements we can make to help prevent slavery and human trafficking

#### **Code of Ethics and training**

We require all our employees to comply with our Code of Ethics, which includes a specific prohibition on using forced or child labor. Guidance is given in the Code of Ethics on how to escalate violations of the Code of Ethics which employees encounter. Our supply chain / procurement team is required to ensure that our products are manufactured in environments which comply with our Code of Ethics.

In addition, to ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chain and our business, we provide regular training to our staff.
